Armed Robbery Investigations in Marrero

Sheriff Newell Normand announces the arrest of Brandon Dorsey, B/M, 18, of 200 George Street in Avondale and Glenn Dickerson, B/M, 20, of 7609 4th Street in Marrero, in connection with two Armed Robbery Investigations.

On April 24, 2010, shortly after 1:30 am, our 911 center received a call of an Armed Robbery in the 2900 block of Dove Avenue in Marrero. The victim, a 49 year old black female, advised she was approached while seated in her vehicle by two black male suspects armed with handguns. The suspects demanded property and fled in a dark colored sedan.

Approximately ten minutes later, our 911 center received a second complaint of an Armed Robbery having occurred in the 1000 block of Curtis Street in Harvey. The victims, a 36 year old white male and a 31 year old white female, reported three black male suspects approached them armed with handguns and demanded money. The suspects fled with the victims' property in a dark colored Ford Contour. This information was broadcast on Police radios.

With the assistance of the Westwego Police Department, the vehicle, a Green 1999 Ford Contour occupied by three black males, was spotted parked in the 7300 block of the Westbank Expressway. One of the suspects was observed entering a business at the location. As responding units attempted to approach the vehicle, the suspect who had entered the business fled on foot making good his escape, leaving two suspects inside the vehicle.

The suspect vehicle then fled and both occupants were observed throwing a handgun from the car. The vehicle came to rest near the intersection of Interstate 310 and River Road in St. Charles Parish after experiencing mechanical problems.

Dickerson and Dorsey were apprehended on scene and a search of the vehicle revealed property belonging to one of the victim's and a third handgun.

Dickerson was arrested by the St. Charles Parish Sheriff's Office for a narcotics violation and upon his release will be brought to Jefferson Parish where he will be booked with three counts of Armed Robbery.

Dorsey was transported to Jefferson Parish where he admitted to his participation in the robberies. He was arrested for three counts of Armed Robbery.

The third suspect, only identified by the nickname of "Black", was captured on video surveillance cameras prior to fleeing from officers on foot.
