On July 21st, the referendum authorized to re-direct the excess millage from SELA match to be used for drainage improvements. I have to emphasize that the SELA match would be the top priority because we want to take full advantage of federal dollars. Whatever is left beyond that, will be used towards local drainage improvement projects. The Drainage Master Plan right now is in the process of being developed and I don't think at this time it is far enough to have a Public Hearing for your Civic Associations. Your area will be added to this study. We will re-visit setting up a meeting with your Civic Association sometime next year.

Jefferson Parish voters approved a measure that expands the use of a 5-mill tax dedicated for projects related to the federal Southeast Louisiana Flood Control program. Under the change, surplus from the tax, which is scheduled to expire in 2012, can be used for drainage projects not financed through the federal program. The tax costs the owner of a \$200,000 home with a homestead exemption \$62.50 annually.

Improvements to Catalpa Court drainage will require more than just work on Catalpa Court. It will require improvements up Hermitage and Oak Alley all the way to Barataria. Kazam,

With the re-occurrence of flooding on Catalpa Court today, a number of homeowners called me for an update. I know the previous email below was just in May, but just wanted to confirm this is on the list for drainage improvements on the Westbank. To my knowledge, this is the only street in Plantation Estates (Marrero) that flows downward away from Oak Alley causing the flow of water to the cul-de-sac, so it might be a job that can be easier to knock out than some much larger scale flooding projects that can carry on for months or years.

Since my last email in May earlier this year, I remember in July we overwhelmingly approved a measure to expand the use of a 5-mill tax dedicated for projects related to the federal SELA program that now can be used for drainage projects not financed through the federal program.

Do you know any time frame that we can address this particular street? Has any list been created for a list of drainage priorities for the Eastbank & Westbank yet? I personally know almost all of the Presidents of Westbank associations and maybe they can help come up with issues in their particular neighborhoods. Just an idea to help if its not already created. Hopefully the use of the SELA money will help.

Thanks for cleaning the drains in the past. It did make some slight improvements, but water still reaching high into their front lawns and approaching the front door.

I know you have a tough job and we greatly appreciate the work you do. Just don't retire anytime soon. We need your expertise now more than ever.

Charles,

The Drainage department has investigated the events of May 4th that lead to the flooding shown at Catalpa Court. The subsurface drainage system in Phase I of Plantation Estates was designed and installed back in 1977, before the implementation of the current 10-year design storm standard that is now utilized in Jefferson Parish. These smaller drain lines were overwhelmed by the significant amount of rain that came down during the 1 to 3 PM time period (almost 5 inches.) When the subsurface system was overwhelmed, the water began to pool at the lowest spot, which is Catalpa Court. Plan elevations show that Catalpa Court is two (2) feet lower than Oak Alley Drive, meaning that excess water from Oak Alley and Hermitage is just flowing downhill to Catalpa. The subsurface drainage master plan that is currently under development will certainly help address this situation and recommend the necessary drain line improvements needed in this area. Presently, we have drainage workers cleaning drain lines and catch basins to make sure the existing system functions to the best of its ability.
